

ICRC's Mission

The International Committee of the Red Cross is an <u>impartial</u>, <u>neutral</u> and <u>independent organization</u> whose exclusively humanitarian mission is <u>to protect the lives and dignity of victims</u> of armed conflict and other situations of violence and to provide them with assistance. The ICRC also endeavors to prevent suffering by promoting and strengthening <u>humanitarian law and universal humanitarian principles</u>.

Established in 1863, the ICRC is at the <u>origin of the Geneva Conventions</u> and the International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement. It <u>directs and coordinates</u> the international activities conducted by the Movement in armed conflict and other situations of violence.



Sources of ICRC mandate

It derives its mandate from:

 Four Geneva Conventions of 1949 and their Additional Protocols

 Statute of the Red Cross / Red Crescent Movement

Resolutions of the int'l RCRC conferences



Statutes of the Int'l RCRC Movement

"to work for the understanding and dissemination of knowledge of international humanitarian law applicable in armed conflicts and to prepare any development thereof"

Right of humanitarian initiative




The ICRC: a unique organization

 - imitation, usurpation, perfidy
